Duncan BAXTER

Pre-enlistment:

- Duncan was born on 20 August 1868, in Glasgow, Scotland to parents Neil and Ann Brown BAXTER
- · He was educated at the Highland Society School in Scotland
- He came to Australia at the age of 33 years
- His home was Townsville, Qld
- He was married to Annie Baxter, Easdale, Paxton Street, Townsville
- He had 7 children, the eldest Pte Neil Baxter was killed at Gallipoli, the second, Lieutenant Angus Baxter returned to Australia
- Prior to enlisting with the AIF, Duncan was a Sergeant in the first Lanarch Royal Engineers Volunteer Corps from 1890 to 1903
- Duncan Baxter's son was 1308 Private Neil Baxter 15th Battalion, killed in action at the Anzac Landing 26th April, 1915, at the age of 21
- Duncan attended to his son, Neil's affairs after his death at Gallipoli until he and his son Angus decided to enlist.

Military Records

- Service Number 1200
- Duncan enlisted on 17 January 1916 with his second eldest son, Angus.
- Both men were original members of C Company of the 42nd Battalion
- Duncan's rank was CQMS Quarter Master Sergeant
- On 5 June 1916, he embarked from Sydney, NSW, on board HMAT A30 Borda
- CQMS Duncan Baxter was severely wounded in both feet, during an action that occurred on St Patrick's Day 1917.
- His son Angus had been with him in the same dugout, when they had been bombarded by high explosive shells. Duncan was evacuated to a clearing station, then hospitalised, but did not survive the severity of his wounds. Angus was unable to be by his side however, was there at his burial Boulogne.
- CQMS Duncan BAXTER 'Died of Wounds' on 31 March 1917 at Polygon Wood, Belgium, aged 48
