THE QRA QUEENS PRIZE MEETING

The Queensland Rifle Association, inaugurated in 1861, is the oldest sporting body in Queensland. It was formed from the ranks of the early volunteer defence movement, the first Queensland Volunteer Force being formed in 1860 by Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony.

Historian Bill Casey's research into the history of the QRA revealed that The Courier, Brisbane, reported that the Queensland Rifle Association was inaugurated at a meeting at Cowell's Victoria Hotel in Brisbane on Wednesday 15th May 1861 (Courier 16/5/1861 p.2).



The Association was "modelled on the plan of the National Rifle Association in Great Britain" having as its Patron, His Excellency, Sir George Bowen, Governor of Queensland. Its President was the Honourable Lieutenant Colonel Maurice Charles O'Connell, Commander of the Queensland Volunteer Rifle Corps and President of Queensland's Legislative Council.

The List of Subscriptions in the First Annual Report of 1863 contains 75 names and the first prize meeting was conducted on 15 September 1863. Nine matches were conducted at ranges from 200 to 600 yards with prizes and a 'purse' of up to £15.

The Annual Prize Meeting of the new Association was held on the Brisbane Rifle Range, from 20 to 24 August 1878. The programme consisted of Cadet matches, teams matches for the Volunteer Units, individual competitions and an international match. The most important match was designated the "Queens" Aggregate and the ranges were 200, 500 and 600 yards, seven rounds at each using Snider rifles and ammunition. In addition to the Silver Medal of the National Rifle Association of Great Britain, and 10 badges provided by the Association, there was prize money totalling £100, (£20 to the winner).

The prizes won during this meeting were presented to the successful competitors by his Excellency the Governor, Sir Arthur Kennedy, in the Exhibition building on Saturday evening, 24 August 1878.







SCORING & SQUADDING

- You will not receive individual scorecards or stickers.
- The Range Register
 - will be located at the firing point on the first range
 - you MUST sign it each day
- A scorecard for your entire squad will be held at the firing point.
- Please use the Barcode to load the new shooter.
- · Scoring:-
 - will be undertaken by the <u>last shooter</u> who will score for the 1st and 2nd shooter
 - o before handing over to the 1st shooter.
- Squadding:
 - o will be finalised when entries close for each event.
 - You will recevie an email when squadding is finalised.
 - We will also have a hard copy print out on the notice board located outside the QRA office and at the firing point.
- Rotation of Targets and shooting order will be advised by the CRO.
- Scorers should use hand sanitser before and after their scoring duties.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at various points on the range.

He will be assisted and supported by Bob Cramp, Phil Kraut, John Menzel and Rob Bell.

Our ET Assist volunteers will be placed across the range. Please ask for assistance as required and if disclaiming shots is required.

THE MATCHES WILL BE SHOT UNDER SSR'S. WE BRING YOUR ATTENTION TO THE FOLLOWING RULES

- SSR 4.5.1.15.2 To assist the Range Officer, no shooter shall bring fired cases to the firing point
- SSR 4.1.1.9 A new shooters time shall not commence before a period of 5 minutes (preparation time) has elapsed from when the previous shooter whose position he is taking has cleared the mound.
- this may also apply when switching between right and left handed shooters



ELECTRONIC TARGETS

Many competitors are now comfortable with the Hex Target system. We still have a number of ET Assist volunteers to help with system issues and advice to competitors.

Whilst some users are quite proficient with the Hex Target system, Range Officers are still the point of reference for determining the need for optional sighters or disclaiming shots recorded on the target.

ELECTRONIC TARGETS

The shooters monitor has a number of features for use by the shooter. The image of your plot can be zoomed in and out as required. The shooter can also view the targets to the left and right, after 3 (three) seconds the image reverts back to the shooters target.

When a shot is fired and not recorded on the target, scorers are to call the Range Officer to determine the course of action.

The role of the Range Officers has not changed, in that they have control of the conduct of shooting.

The scorers monitor is the control point for entering new shooter details.

The scorer undertakes all normal scoring functions from this monitor. This is not a touch screen, all controls are executed through the keyboard.

ZONES AT EACH RANGE




A series of line marking will indicate zones at each range.

The area forward of the white line is for shooters, scorer, RO's, ET's and officials.

Between the white line and yellow line (illustration only) is the area for waiting competitors and equipment. Between the yellow and red lines is the area for approved vehicles to park. After allowing for a driveway, all other vehicles may park in the remaining space.

1000 YARDS

An area at the rear of the chairs has been cordened off for shooters equipment. Parking at 1000 yards is only for official vehicles, with some limited parking for those with mobility issues. A "stop drop and go" facility is available.
