- Prior to enlistment he lived in Mackay, Qld
- His occupation was that of a labourer in the sugar industry

- John enlistment on 6 February 1915, in Mackay, aged 27 year 10 months
- He was a Private with 25th Battalion, D Company
- He embarked from Brisbane, Qld, on board HMAT A60 Aeneas on 29 June 1915 with his Unit, 25th Infantry Battalion, aged 27 years
- He served and fought in Gallipoli from 4 September 1915
- He disembarked from the 'Hororata' in Alexandria on 9 January 1916
- He then arrived in France 19 March 1916
- He took part in a successful raid on enemy trenches 26 – 29 June 1916
- He was Promoted to Lance Corporal 7 July 1916
- Lance Corporal John BISSET was 'Killed in Action' on 29 July 1916, in Pozieres, France.
