

James Archibald LINDSAY



Pre-enlistment:

- James was born on 14 May, 1887 in Ipswich
- He was the son of John & Mary Ann Lindsay
- He attended Ipswich Grammar School, Qld
- Worked in Ipswich Railway Workshops for 6 years, travelling to America to further his training as an iron fitter in 1911
- His occupation was that of an engineer

Military Records

- Service Number 34
- 22 August 1914 James enlisted, being attached to 3rd Field Company Engineers
- On 22 September 1914 he embarked on HMAT Geelong, Melbourne
- He served in Gallipoli as a Sapper, 3rd Field Company Engineers
- Sapper James Archibald LINDSAY was 'Killed in Action' on 10 May 1915, aged 27 years, at ANZAC Cove, Gallipoli during the 15th day of the campaign
- He was buried on the same day with a cross erected as his headstone with the inscription of "Their Glory Will Not Be Blotted Out"
