- His mother was E. Burge, 66 King William St, Fitzroy, Victoria
- · His occupation at the time of his enlistment was that of a labourer
- He was single

Previous Military Service

 He served at the Australian Expeditionary Force to Rabaul (German New Guinea) reaching Thursday Island.

Military Record

- Service Number 372
- George James BURGE enlisted on 23 June 1915 in Atherton, Old
- He was attached to the 26th Battalion. B Company in the 1st AIF
- On 24 May 1915 he embarked as a Private with his Unit on board the HMAT Ascanius, from Brisbane
- His name was recorded as BERGE on one of his Attestation papers but corrected to Burge.
- On VWMA website is entered as Berge not Burge
- He embarked from Alexandria on 4 September 1915 to join the Mediterranean Military Force, Gallipoli.
- After being injured he was transferred to 7th Field Ambulance at Mudros on Lemnos on 21 December 1915 then returned to his Unit on recovery.
- He disembarked Alexandria for Marsailles, France on 21
 March 1916 to join his Unit in France
- Private George James BURGE died on 5 November 1916 at Mouquet Farm, France
- His war serice was in Gallipoli, Egypt and on the Western Front
