

John Thomas CARROLL

Pre-enlistment:

- John was born in Cooktown, North Queensland to parents Matthew & Bridget Carroll of Cooktown
- He attended the Catholic School in Cooktown
- His occupation was that of a Railway Porter at the time of his enlistment



Military Record

- Service Number: 732
- John CARROLL enlisted on 28 September 1914 in Townsville as a Private with 15th Battalion, E Company, aged 24 years
- He embarked with his Unit from Melbourne on board Transport A40 Ceramic for Alexandria on 20 May 1915
- On 31 May 1915 he joined his Battalion on the Gallipoli Peninsula
- On 16 August 1915 he was reported missing, a Court of Inquiry followed
- Private John CARROLL was Killed In Action at Gallipoli on 8 August 1915
- His War Service was in Egypt and Gallipoli
