Joseph Mark HIRST

Pre-enlistment:

- Joseph HIRST was born in Melbourne to parents, Joseph and Helena HIRST, State School, Aspley, Queensland and a native of Sydney
- · His occupation on enlistment was that of a clerk
- · His place of association prior to enlistment was Townsville
- Previous Military Service was with the Artillery Volunteer Force, Brisbane and Townsville
- His brother, W HIRST, obtained a Military Medal; his step brother: T Hensley, obtained his Commission as Lieutenant.

Military Records

- Service Number: 4691
- Joseph HINGST enlisted on 1 or 23 February 1915 as a Gunner, aged 22 years 5 months
- On 10 August 1915 he was attached to 3rd Field Artillery Brigade, Third Ypres
- He and his Unit embarked from Melbourne, Victoria, on board RMS Persia on 10 August 1915
- On 29 September 1915 he transferred to 4th Artillery Division, in Tel-el-Kebir, the Australian Army Training Camp in Egypt
- · On 19 March 1916 he was promoted Sergeant
- On 1 June 1916 he embarked Alexandria, then disembarked Marsailles on 10 June 1916
- He was promoted 2nd Lieutenant 20 June 1916 in the Field
- On 25 June 1916 he was Taken on Strength in the Field
- He was promoted Lieutenant on 1 October 1916
- On 19 September 1917 he was transferred to 10th Field Artillery Brigade
- Lieutenant Joseph HIRST was Killed in Action 21
 September 1917 at Ypres, Belgium aged 26 years
- His war service was in Egypt and on the Western Front.
