Pre-enlistment:

- George Miller was born in Bowen, Queensland to parents, Robert and Margaret MILLER, of Bowen, Queensland
- He attended Bowen State School
- His home address was Hopetoun, Bowen
- His occupation prior to enlistment was that of a farmer
- He was not married
- His next of kin was his mother, Mrs Margaret Miller, Hopetoun, Bowen, Queensland
- He was currently serving with 27th Australian Light Horse for 1 year prior to enlistment

Military Records

- Service Number: 1938
- George Miller enlisted on 10 January 1916 as a Private with 52nd Battalion 3rd Reinforcement
- He embarked with his Unit from Brisbane on board HMAT A46 Clan McGillivray on 1 May 1916 aged 20 years
- His War Service was in the Campaign on the Western Front
- Private George Campbell Miller died of wounds on 4 April 1918 at Messines, Belgium aged 22 years
