

Frederick TAMBLYN



Pre-enlistment:

- Frederick Tamblyn was born at Logan, Qld to parents, John and Hannah Maria TAMBLYN, of 126 Villiers Street, New Farm, Brisbane
- He attended State Schools in Queensland
- His home town was Southport, Gold Coast, Qld then later he noted his address in Charters Towers, Qld as a single man
- His occupation was that of a baker
- His next of kin was listed as his brother, Jack Tamblyn, Charters Towers

Military Records

- Service Number: 1387
- Frederick Tamblyn enlisted on 31 August 1914 in Sydney, NSW as a Private with the 3rd Battalion, G Company
- On 20 October 1914 he embarked with his Unit on the HMAT Euripides, from Sydney, aged 33 years
- His last Unit was with the 3rd Infantry Battalion
- His war service was in Egypt and Gallipoli
- Private Frederick Tamblyn was killed in action at Lone Pine, Gallipoli between 7 - 12 August 1915, aged 33 years
