

# Henry Joshua VAUGHAN



## Pre-enlistment:

- Henry Vaughan was born on 25 July 1888 in Maryborough, Qld, to parents George Frederick and Lizzie Jane VAUGHAN, Archbold Road, Roseville, Sydney. Native of Maryborough, Qld
- He attended Sydney Grammar School, NSW. Later he passed the qualifying examination of the Australian Corporation of Accountants and then went on to follow accountancy as his occupation.
- His address was at Nara Prince Street, Mosman, NSW
- His next of kin was listed as his father, G F Vaughan, Nara Prince Street, Mosman

## Previous Military Service

- Served at the Australian expeditionary Force to Rabaul (New Guinea) reaching Thursday Island -on the 'Kanowna'

## Military Records

- Service Number: 1441
- Henry Vaughan enlisted on 24 December 1914, as a Private with the 9th Infantry Battalion 20th Reinforcement at Enoggera, Qld.
- On 7 September 1916 he embarked with his Unit for Third Ypres on the HMAT Clan McGillivray, aged 26 years
- On 12 November 1917 he took part in the Battle at Third Ypres with his Unit
- His last Unit was the 9th Infantry Battalion
- His war service was in the Campaign on the Western Front
- Corporal Henry Joshua VAUGHAN died of wounds on 12 November 1917 he sustained at Passchendaele, Ypres, Belgium, aged 29 years
