

George Thomas Mitchell CLARKE

Pre-enlistment:

- George was born in Glenmawn, NSW
- He studied for 2 years in chemistry
- His occupation on enlistment was that of an Engineer Fitter
- He was married to Mrs E Clarke & lived at 'Bryn-y-Nor', Andrew Street, Meadowbank, NSW
- His town of association was Charters Towers, Kennedy, Nth Qld
- Previous military service: He served a number of years in North Kennedy Infantry Reg (Colour Sergeant) and about three years in 29th Infantry, NSW
- He was a great grandson of the late Captain W Mitchell who served under Wellington during the Napoleonic Wars
- Family Connections: Pte Apsley Bradford, 55th Batt. Cpl. Robert Bruce Bradford 17th Batt. were cousins and both killed in action. Lieut. Bert Bradford, MC, was also a cousin, he was wounded at Lagnicourt



Military Record

- Service Number: 205
- George Thomas Mitchell CLARKE enlisted in the AIF on 22 August 1914, Sydney as a Sergeant with 1st Battalion, B Company
- His embarkation with his Unit from Sydney, NSW, on board Transport A19 Africa on 18 October 1914, aged 33 years
- Sergeant George CLARKE was Killed in Action at Gallipoli on the afternoon of 4 May 1915 aged 33 years
- His War service was in Egypt and Gallipoli
