- He had a sister, Miss Rachel Martin, and bother Frank, both of Mackay
- He attended Coningsby State School, Qld
- His occupation on enlistment was that of a was labourer, cane grower, horse breaker
- His address was Mandarna, Mackay, Queensland
- He was Single
- His next of kin as identified on his enlistment papers was his brother, Frank
 Martin who lived in Mackay

Military Records

- Service Number: 495
- Robert Martin enlisted on 31 October 1914, with 5th Light Horse, at Cloncurry, aged 31 years
- On 19 December 1914 he embarked as a Private, with his Unit on HMAT 'Vestalia', from Sydney
- He was wounded in action at Gallipoli
- Trooper Robert Martin Died of Disease on 27 August 1915 (Peritonitis) secondary to perforating enteric ulcer. He died at sea on board 'Assaye', off the coast of Greece aged 32 years
- His War Service was in Gallipoli.
