

Bertie Reginald ANDREWS



Pre-enlistment:

- Bertie was born at Ma Ma Creek, Queensland, on the 11 August 1897 to parents David and Fleurine Elise Andrews of Laicourt, Ma Ma Creek
- His schooling was at Ma Ma Creek State School, Qld
- At the time of his enlistment his home address was in Grantham, Lockyer Valley, Qld, where he lived as a single man.
- His occupation on enlistment was that of a farmer

Military Records

- Service Number 4358
- Bertie Andrews enlisted on 30 November 1915 in Brisbane as a Private with the 25th Infantry Battalion, aged 18 years 4 months
- On 31 March 1916 he embarked on the HMAT Star of Victoria, from Sydney for Egypt for further training
- He left Egypt and disembarked in Marseilles, France where he was taken on strength by the 26th Battalion on 2 August 1916
- He was severely wounded on 5 August 1916 with a gun shot wound to the right foot, then transferred to Bristol, England on 9 August 1916 for treatment and then a period of furlough
- He returned to France on 1 August 1918 where he was taken on strength on 7 August 1918 by the 25th Infantry Battalion
- His War Service was in Egypt and on the Western Front.
- Private Bertie Reginald Andrews was killed in action at Villers-Bretonneux, the Somme, France, on 10 June 1918, aged 20 years
- He had two brothers: 2127 Private George Henry Andrews, killed in action on 9 June 1917; and Private James Martin Andrews, killed in action 5 August 1916
