
James Martin ANDREWS

Pre-enlistment:

- James was born on 7 June 1890 in Ma Ma Creek near Grantham, Qld to parents of late David Andrews and Fleurine Elise Andrews of 'Laicourt' Ma Ma Creek
- · He attended school at Ma Ma Creek State School
- He was employed in managing his mother's farm at the time of enlistment



Military Records

- Service Number: 4357
- James Andrews enlisted on 29 October 1915 in Brisbane with the 25th Battalion
- · He was in training camped in Brisbane
- He embarked on 29 March 1916 with his Unit on HMAT Star of Victoria, from Brisbane and disembarked in Alexandria on 10 May 1916.
- On 10 May 1916 he left Alexandria on the HT Scotian.
- · He was taken on strength in France on 2 August
- · He was reported missing three days later.
- A Court of Inquiry found he was killed in action that day.
- His War Service was in Egypt and on the Western Front.
- Private James Martin Andrews was killed in action on 5 August 1916, in the Somme France only two days after arriving at the front. He was aged 26 years
- He had two brothers: 2127 Private George Henry Andrews, killed in action, 9 June 1917; Private Bertie Reginald Andrews, 25th Battalion, killed in action, 10 June 1918.
