John DRANEY

Pre-enlistment:

- John was born in Drayton, Qld on 4 July 1890 to parents, John Davis and Charlotte DRANEY, Myall Street, Dalby, Qld
- · His schooling was at Toowoomba Christian Brothers
- · He lived at home with his parents in Dalby and was single
- · His occupation at time of enlistment was that of a carpenter
- His next of kin was listed as his father, John Davis Draney, Myall Street, Dalby
- His brother, 438 Pte Richard James DRANEY, 5th Machine Gun Bn, returned to Australia, 12 December 1918.



Military Records

- Service number: 350
- John Draney enlisted on 29 October 1914 in Dalby as a Private with 5th Light Horse Regiment, C Squadron, aged 24 years 3 months
- He embarked with his Unit from Sydney, NSW, on board HMAT A34 Persic on 21 December 1914, aged 24
- He proceeded to join the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force at Gallipoli on 16 May 1915
- After 4 months he was admitted to hospital on Lemnos then transferred to Southern General Hospital, Edgbaston, Birmingham for Dysentery
- On 16 February 1916 he embarked Weymouth to re-join his Unit. He disembarked Alexandria on 28 February and taken on strength by 2nd Light Horse Regiment at Maadi (near Cairo) on 1 March 1916 and returned to active duty
- On 30 April 1916 he was transferred to 5th Light Horse Regiment at Tel-el-Kebir.

- Lance Corporal John Draney was killed in action 9 August 1916 in the Suez Canal Zone, aged 26 years
- His was service was at Gallipoli and in the Middle East.
