### Pre-enlistment:

- John was born in Kalk Bay, Cape Town, South Africa
- His parents were Alfred William and May ETHELL, The Rectory, Laidley, Queensland
- He gained his education through State and Private Tuition & he was a student for Holy Orders with the Church of England
- His occupation was that of a teacher and at the time of enlistment was on the teaching staff at Laidley South State School
- He was a Patrol Leader in Baden Powell's Scouts.
- He lived at The Rectory in Laidley, Queensland as a clergyman's son.

# **Military Records**

- · Service Number: 3341
- John Ethell enlisted on 7 October 1915 as a Sapper with 6th Field Company Engineers, in Brisbane
- He embarked with his Unit from Sydney, NSW on board HMAT A40
  Ceramic on 24 November 1915 as a 2nd Lieutenant with 23rd Battalion
- On 12 Mach 1916 he was re-instated as a Private then on 19 March he embarked at Alexandria for Marsailles where he disembarked on 27 March 1916
- On 6 June 1916 was transferred from Etaples, France to England where he was admitted to hospital with synovitis of the right knee then discharged on 9 August 1916
- On 25 September he proceeded overseas to France and reported for duty on 5 October 1916
- · He was promoted 2nd Lieutenant on 3 April 1917
- On 8 April 1917 he was taken on strength by 23rd Battalion in France
- He was wounded in action on 3 May 1917 at Bullecourt whilst in charge of a bombing party, then invalided back to England.
- On 21 August he again proceeded overseas to France and re-joined his Unit at the Front.

- Lieutenant John Ethell was killed in action on 4 October 1917, at Broodseinde, Passchendaele, Belgium aged 21 years 6 months
- His O.C. wrote of him: "In his death I have lost one of my most promising officers."
- The Padre wrote of him: "We all expected him to take a big place in the Army as he had all the qualities of a good officer".
- His War Service was in Egypt and the Western Front
