# Roger Bernard FULLER

#### Pre-enlistment:

- Roger was born in Maryborough Qld to parents, Charles FULLER and Margaret BUCKLEY (his wife), "Tanara", Maryborough, Queensland
- He was educated at Mt Shamrock State School, Qld
- He lived as a single man in Biggenden, Burnett, Qld and was often referred to as Bernard
- His occupation was a farmer at the time of enlistment
- His next of kin was lister as his father, Charles Fuller, Didcot, Gayndah Railway, Qld



## **Military Records**

- Service Number: 4702
- Roger Berbard Fuller enlisted on 10 January 1916 in Brisbane, as a Private with 25th Battalion, 12th Reinforcement
- He embarked with his Unit embarked from Sydney, NSW, on board RMS Mooltan on 12 April 1916
- He was on duty in Rollestone, England before departing for France on 9 September 1916 and marched into his Unit on 28 September 1916
- He was initially reported missing on 14 November 1916
- Private Roger Bernard Fuller was killed in action on 14 November 1916, in France aged 22 years
- · His War Service was on the Western Front

## Cemetery &/or Memorial

- Private Fuller was initially buried 4½ miles northwest of Combles, France then his remains were exhumed and re-interred at the Warlencourt New British Cemetery (Plot II, Row D, Grave No. 26), 2½ miles north west of Bapaume, France
