Stanley GREENBURY

Pre-enlistment:

- Stanley was born in 1895 at Glenvale, in Toowoomba, Qld to parents, Spink and Margaret GREENBURY, Glenvale, Toowoomba
- · He attended the Public School, in Glenvale, Qld
- · His occupation at time of enlistment was that of a blacksmith
- He lived in Toowoomba as a single man
- His next of kin was listed as his mother, Mrs Margaret Ann Greenbury, Glenvale, Toowoomba
- His previous military service was with 11th Infantry
- · He had two brothers who enlisted for service:
 - 109 Driver Leslie Sydney Greenbuty, 42nd Bn, died of cerebro-spinal fever, 4 December 1916;
 - 325 Sydney Anderson, 2nd Light Horse, RTA.

Military Records

- Service Number: 1021, 1207
- Stanley Greenbury enlisted on 20 March 1916 in Brisbane as a Private with 42nd Battalion, D Company
- He embarked with his Unit from Sydney, NSW, on board HMAT A30 Borda on 5 June 1916, aged 21
- He disembarked at Southampton on 23 July 1916
- He proceeded overseas on 25 November 1916 with the 42nd Battalion to France
- On 22 December 1916 he was taken on strength by the 11 Field Ambulance for duty
- On 15 February 1918 he was subsequently detached back to the 42nd Battalion
- Then he re-joined his Unit (11th Field Ambulance) from 42nd Battalion
- Private Stanley GREENBURY was killed in action on 2 October 1918 at Bony, near St Quentin, France, while on active duty with 11th Field Ambulance, aged 23
- His war service was on the Western Front
