

# Frederick MacDONALD



## Pre-enlistment:

- Frederick was born in Rockhampton, Qld
- At the time of his enlistment was a railway employee
- He was married to Maude MacDonald
- He listed his next of kin as his sister, Nellie MacDonald, of Rockhampton

## Military Records

- Service Number: 1792
- Frederick MacDonald enlisted on 22 January 1915 as a Private with the 13th Infantry Battalion, 4th Reinforcements, in Liverpool NSW, aged 24 years 1 month
- On 17 March 1915 he embarked from Sydney on board HMAT Shropshire
- On 22 August 1915 he was admitted to hospital from the Gallipoli Peninsula to West Mudros, on recovery he was discharged on 5 September 1915
- He re-joined his Unit at Gallipoli on 15 September
- His war service was on the Gallipoli Peninsula
- Private Frederick MacDonald was killed in action on 5 November 1915, at Gallipoli with the 13th Battalion
